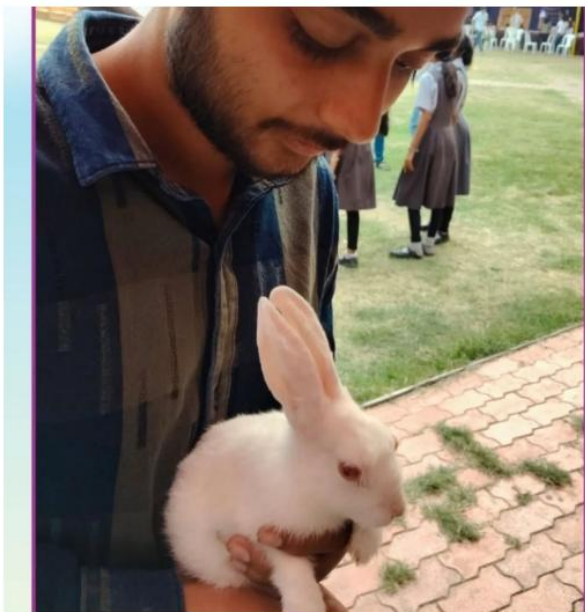
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Students enthusiastically enjoyed interacting with the Nature's Club pet animals and watching various performances on the ground.
